Message from the Manse



You might wonder what "Prayer 2020" is all about:

"Pray in 2020 on the 20th of each month at 20:20 for 20 minutes

Pray ... that God will give many opportunities to speak about Christ. (Colossians 4:3 New Living Translation)

This is the invitation from HOPE Together to Christians of all denominations.

Through Prayer 2020 we are asking God to work through all that is done in 2020 – personal witness; church outreach plans in villages, towns and cities; stadium events – evangelisation in all its many forms.

HOPE's executive director Roy Crowne says, 'Already this is catching the imagination of Christians around the world. 2020 is such a significant year and Prayer 2020 will be a key part of the year.' In 2020 churches and ministries are working together for an intentional, strategic and Spirit-filled year of mission across the UK called Advance 2020. HOPE Together is one of the major partners alongside many others.

'We want to see the gift of the evangelist released to equip the whole people of God as witnesses, so the people we love and pray for, who don't yet know Jesus, can have an opportunity to hear about him in relevant ways and respond,' says Roy.

I heard about this initiative about 5 days ago when I was at an Ecumenical Officers' meeting. I am passionate about prayer. As soon as I heard about this initiative, I wondered about how we might become part of this

But also, to pray for those called to the ministry of evangelism (a specific calling for people) but also to all of us who are called to live out our faith in our daily lives, so that we will be a shining light of the Gospel. Also to pray for the different groups we have in the churches across the Missional Partnership, that we will have the confidence to share the Good News of Jesus.

I am hoping that across the Missional Partnership we will hold evenings of prayer on the 20th of each month. It may be that we can also have gatherings during the day as well, for people who might not want/be able to come out at night – certainly in the darker evenings.



The first of these will take place on Monday 20th January at Chapel. People from other churches in the Missional Partnership and Church Together in NW Rochdale will be invited to join us. Start time 7.30pm.

Last but by no means least, a Happy Christmas to everyone at Bamford Chapel and Norden URC and all the very best for 2020!



This is an extract from the Foodbank Newsletter for October written by Marin Coupe, one of the Trustees.

"It is just over 6 months since our founders lain and Margaret Wight decided to retire from their work here and we are extremely grateful for the strong foundations that they built. Following their departure, we had to build a new structure for the years ahead, meaning that the 10 Trustees now have more on their shoulders than they did before. The 6 working Trustees have taken on a number of specific responsibilities such as premises, finance etc, and work an on-call rota so that team leaders can refer to them with specific and urgent issues and questions. So far this arrangement seems to be working well."

"The demands on our foodbank continue unabated; we serve on average nearly 100 clients each week and food donations from the generous people of Rochdale continue to arrive. Over the summer we had to buy in considerable amounts of food to top up our supplies, no easy task, requiring money, manpower and transport to get purchases to South Parade. Now of course we welcome the many generous Harvest donations from schools and churches."

"Our income from cash donations continues to support our considerable overheads plus the food purchases we have to make. We are reliant on regular donations, gift aid reclaim and one-off donations, the latter of course being hard to predict when setting budgets. Over the past 6 months we have been engaged in bringing our rented accommodation up to required health and safety standards. Volunteers will have seen improvements in lighting upstairs at South Parade, the installation of new emergency lighting, smoke alarms and fire extinguishers, and the introduction of a regular cleaning service. These have led to a safer, better working environment for all our volunteers."

"Our focus remains to provide emergency food and a welcoming ear to those in need. Clearly, we could not do this without the invaluable support of our volunteers, and also the huge assistance of all our agencies and our partner churches and schools. I pay tribute and give thanks to everyone who contributes to helping our clients in times of distress. The team leaders and all the staff do a wonderful job in pulling everything together to maintain this unique voluntary service. The



Trustees never fail to recognise all the hard work and energy of our volunteers to whom we say a big thank you."

Can one person really make a difference?



Yes – one person can make a HUGE difference to a person in crisis. Adelle (URC Synod Trust Officer) felt the Holy Spirit say 'Turn around and pray with that man' outside Asda. Although very uncomfortable with praying with a stranger, she felt compelled to do so. As she prayed he grasped her hand. She saw such sorrow in his eyes

She sat in her car and wept – feeling prayer is not enough, we have to do more. Thinking 'Who will God send?' Knowing he has to have willing souls to send. Feeling she was no-one of importance, she had no money that could make a difference, and no contacts that would make a difference, she asked God to show the way.

In her spare time, for the past year, Adelle has been visiting charities and other agencies, the local council, the police and various forums to see where people fall through the gaps - making contacts and trying to see how the churches or Christians could help.

Whilst feeling that there was huge potential to do more, but not really knowing where God was leading, Adelle had the idea of a small project to help new mothers who were struggling financially. She put an advert on an online classified ads site, seeking donations of baby items. Soon someone messaged, not with a donation, but asking for help - saying she had nothing and baby was due soon.

Adelle and a friend from church visited the young lady and were shocked to find she had so little – just one chair, a mattress on the floor, no curtains, indeed she had very little. The problem was that she'd been an asylum seeker 12 years ago. She had been granted right to remain and previously renewed with no issues, but this time her renewal had been rejected. Now because she had no right to remain she had lost her job and she was not entitled to any public funds. She was no longer with baby's dad. She had truly fallen through the gaps in services. No-one could help her until her appeal was completed.

Adelle set about contacting various charities to help provide food, furniture, maternity clothing and baby items – and legal advice. She sourced free items from classified ad sites – sofa and chairs, bed, washing machine, curtains, Moses basket, bedding etc.

The girl asked why Adelle, her husband and her friend from church would do all this – when no-one else wanted to help. Adelle said.... "because Jesus loves us, we love you!"

Adelle went on to help other members of the family in similar renewal appeal situations, working with 6 charities, involving 5 churches (in different parts of the Country) to help people who had been living in fear and financial crisis. The girl started to attend Bible study and Alpha course. Her family are now supported by local churches – wonderful!

Can you help?

Adelle is currently hoping to co-ordinate a Christmas meal for lonely people in Rochdale, for those who have no family or friends to be with. If you could help with this, if you'd love to put a smile on the face of a stranger this Christmas, or If you are interested in community volunteering generally – Adelle would love to hear from you.

"Flashback News" according to former Church Secretary Norden URC December 2015

(taken from "The Lectern" which is the Norden, Bamford & Ashworth Churches Newsletter)

"The new project for Harvest to Christmas was launched in September.
